This year has been another very successful year for Rossmoyne Primary School. Thank you to everyone for your support and contributions.



School Board Update

The last Board meeting for the year was held last Monday. The Board examined our 2020 Preliminary Student Centred Funding Statement and discussed and approved the 2020 Preliminary Cash and Salary Plans. It was noted that the school's funding could be up to \$85 000 less in 2020, when compared to this year's funding. The main reason for this is the introduction of proficiency standards for EAL/D (English as an Additional Language or Dialect) students. Many of our EAL/D students will meet the standards, so will not receive funding in 2020 and beyond. This will have an impact on the amount of support time available in classrooms and will also result in learning area budgets being reduced. We will also carry forward less money in both our cash and salary plans to 2021 than we have in previous years.

I would like to thank all the members of the School Board for their support and

efforts throughout this year. Particular mention must be made of Mr Patrick Chen, Mrs Leia Hunt, Mrs Selina Valentine and Mrs Joanna Ashby whose tenures on the Board have now finished. Consequently, we will be seeking nominations for these Parent and Staff Representative vacancies early next year. The first Board meeting for 2020 will be held on Monday 30th March.




