

Learning from Home and Cyber Safety

As most of our students will be participating in learning from home for the duration of Term 2, 'online safety' for our students is an issue we need to be concerned about. A new guide to online safety for parents and carers has been released by the eSafety Commissioner. It can be accessed at https://www.esafety.gov.au/key-issues/covid-19/advice-parents-carers

eSafety's top tips for parents in protecting their kids online include:

- using parental controls in apps and devices to monitor and limit what your child does online;
- setting time limits for using devices during non-school hours;
- keeping your kids in open areas of the home when they are using their devices;
- turning on or reviewing privacy settings to restrict who contacts your child in apps and games; and
- keeping engaged through co-view and co-play by joining in with your child's online activities.

As most of our students will be participating in virtual lessons via WebEx, it's also timely for us to consider and discuss online etiquette. The information contained over the page from @thinkingpathways may assist you in having these discussions with your child/ren.

Ensure you are dressed appropriately.


No singlet tops or low cut tops.
