School Board

The next School Board meeting will be held on Monday 14 June. The School Board will be updated about the implementation of the 2021 Operational Plans; will receive a finance update; will discuss and be asked to endorse our Complaints Management policy that was recently reviewed by staff; and will discuss our upcoming Public School Review and the 'Our School, Our Say' Forum that will be held next term.

National Reconciliation Week National Reconciliation Week occurs every year between 27 May and 3 June. These dates are significant because they commemorate the anniversary of the 1967 referendum which saw Australians' vote overwhelmingly to amend the Constitution to allow the Commonwealth to make laws for Aboriginal people and include them in the census (27 May); the anniversary of the High Court decision in Mabo, which overturned the notion of 'terra nullius' ('land belonging to no one'); and paved the way for recognition of Aboriginal rights to land, and subsequently, the Native Title Act 1993 (3 June).

National Reconciliation Week is a chance for all Australians to learn about our shared histories. achievements and cultures and to continue to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The theme of this year's National Reconciliation Week is "More Than a Word-Reconciliation Takes Action" and urges the nation towards braver and more impactful action.

The first School Board for 2021 was held on Monday 10th May, and Jessica was re-elected to the position of Board Chairperson. The meeting agenda included our school's:

- 2020 Annual Report;
- 2021 School Funding Agreement and Student Centred Funding Statement;
- 2021 to 2024 Statement of Expectations;
- Self-assessment policy;
- 2021 School Board and Engagement and Connection plan; and
- the preferred 2022 to 2024 Personal Items' Agreement supplier.

The school's newly developed Self-assessment policy was discussed in great detail, before being unanimously endorsed. Implementation of the policy will commence this year and will be reviewed again by staff in 2022.

As most of you will be already aware, we are lucky enough to have an active Parents & Citizens group. The group works closely with Rochelle and the rest of the staff to ensure that funds raised via parent contributions and through fundraising efforts are focused to best support the school and enrich the students' experiences.

This effort is primarily achieved through the groups' management of regular / recurring events such as discos, the Second-hand Uniform Shop and the Book Fair, and "special" events such as Subway days, Colour Runs and Movie nights, (which we are hoping to repeat in the future).

All of these events are of course hugely enjoyed by the children and go a long way to help us maintain the sense of community across the school. Some of the key achievements of the P&C over the last couple of years have included contributing funding (to the tune of a \$25 000 contribution) to the new Preprimary playground; petitioning for, and instigating the installation of the new school crossing on Third Avenue; and providing road safety and cyber security training for the students.



However for these events to continue, the P&C need your support! We are always keen to see new faces at P&C meetings and hear fresh ideas, but more critically, the P&C needs a core group of volunteers to stand on the committee. New positions open up each year as children, and hence families, move out of the school. Unfortunately without elected members on the committee we are not able to action any financial activities — put simply this means WE CANNOT RUN ANY EVENTS (including discos, the Second-hand Uniform Shop, Book Club etc....). We are close to convening the committee for this year but still need to fill the roles of Secretary, Treasurer and the Second-hand Uniform Shop Coordinator.

These roles are not overly time consuming but do require you to attend meetings which are held twice each term. Please feel free to contact me if you feel you may be able to assist with these roles, would like additional information, or are keen to play a part in supporting the P&C. 
