Before the assembly, all visitors, guests, students and staff walked through the Smoking Ceremony conducted by Noongar Yorga (woman elder) Robyn Collard. On their way to assembly all students then contributed their artwork to form a whole school art piece of an Aboriginal flag. The assembly began with Robyn conducting Welcome to Country. The whole school sang our National Anthem in both Noongar and English, before the students in Room 19 conducted the assembly, which included them singing a song called 'Recognise' in both English and Noongar.



During the assembly, we also celebrated the installation of our three new flagpoles that our P&C were able to purchase through a City of Canning grant. The assembly finished with the whole school singing 'Wanjoo'. The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags were then raised next to the Australian flag for the very first time at our school.

We were very grateful to receive a message stick with parts of our school logo on it from Robyn as a memory of this very special occasion. Special thanks to Nousha Sas, our school's Reconciliation Committee Coordinator; all staff, parent/carer and student members of our Reconciliation Committee; and to Mr Corbett and the Room 19 students for their efforts organising and facilitating this very moving assembly.



After the assembly, Robyn Collard commented that 'I was very impressed. What a fantastic celebration. It was truly inspiring and gave me hope for the future. Your students were incredibly respectful'.




# Quintet Performance




